## The Sorrowful Mysteries

First Sorrowful Mystery:

### **The Agony in the Garden**

*True contrition for our sins*

The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. And I am the foremost of sinners.

-1 Tim 1:15

God our Savior desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all.

Second Sorrowful Mystery:

### **The Scourging at the Pillar**

*Purity*

Our great God and Savior Jesus Christ . . . gave himself for us to redeem us from all iniquity and to purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.

-Titus 2:13b-14

For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by men and hating one another, but when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us . . . in virtue of his own mercy.

Third Sorrowful Mystery:

### **The Crowning with Thorns**

*Courage*

In the presence of God who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, . . . the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

### **The Carrying of the Cross**

*Patience*

For to this end we toil and strive, because we have set our hope on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of those who believe.

Fifth Sorrowful Mystery:

### **The Crucifixion and Death of Our Lord**

*Conformity to the Divine Will*

If we have died with him, we shall also live with him; if we endure, we shall also reign with him.
